This year the The TPA was created by the County and it is funded almost entirely by bed tax. TPA will receive almost 1 Million dollars in bed tax money.

Our decision to move to decertify the TPA is purely a fundamental change to not only market our current assets such as DelGrosso's Park, Altoona Curve, etc., it is also focused on asset development.

We believe in doing this, we will create more interest in Blair Co. which will bring more people into our community to stay in our motels, eat in our restaurants and shop in our We have spent the past 9 months discussing this and trying to find a path forward that does not local communities.

had over 60 people in attendance telling us the Commissioners, we need to do something. We have neighboring counties who have and continue to foster, build and promote trails and ask us, when are you going to join us, we could make this a regional place for people to come and stay. We have talked in length regarding the development of trails. We held a public meeting which

For the past 9 months, this has been discussed in the Chamber's Transportation Committee and I Chair the Transportation Trail Sub Committee that has also discussed this in length. Members of the local TPA sit on many of these committees where this has been discussed.

Recently I received numerous calls regarding the TPA and the Commissioners decided it would be best to have a meeting with all of the parties who had questions to dispel any rumors of false claims. Due to scheduling conflicts with the TPA, this was never held, nor the TPA provide a suitable date, even when asked to do so.

The TPA then sent numerous certified letters to the Commissioners requesting a meeting with "only" the members of the TPA. It was communicated to the TPA this could not occur because it was something we would be voting on. We want to be clear, this action in no way punitive, nor does this have anything to do with the Explore Altoona Board members or its staff. We as well as many members of this community believe this to be a positive move for this community and to further build assets that will promote growth in our county. Motioned by Commissioner Kessling, seconded by Commissioner Webster, approved to adopt Resolution 445-2024 with the abstention as noted.
