- Missy included a list of approved demolitions in the agenda packet.
- There are not any pending projects.
- All projects are completed and paid.

# **Program Updates**

First Time Home Buyer Program (Jodi Williams)

- Jodi reported that there is a closing this Friday. The \$3,000 award has been approved by the Commissioners.
- Missy stated that Blair County Community Action Program (BCCAP) is to get an administrative fee for each 1<sup>st</sup> Time Home Buyer application that is processed. BCCAP invoiced the AHTF for \$150.00, but it cannot be paid until a motion is passed by the Board recommending the Commissioners approve a set fee for each application processed by BCCAP.

• Jim Gehret made a motion to approve an allocation of \$150.00 per application from the AHTF to be paid to Blair County Community Action Program (BCCAP) for an administrative processing fee for the 1<sup>st</sup> Time Home Buyer Program. Scott Durbin seconded the motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

#### Weatherization/Housing Rehab Program (Jodi/Trina)

CCA/BCCAP has deferred weatherization/housing rehab requests to Trina Illig, who is
using the Owner-Occupied Rehab funding for these projects. This funding is used county
wide.

# Operation Safe Space (Jodi Williams)

• Program has no funding at this time.

#### Homeless Family Shelter Update (Lisa Hann)

- Current Data:
  - o 18 individuals in the shelter (4 men, 10 women & 4 children/No Vets)
  - o 394 individuals served since opening (259 adults and 135 children)
  - o 10 emergency overnight stays
  - o 1 intake scheduled today
  - o 3 successful discharges
  - o 10 involuntary discharges
  - o 3 extensions denied (Did not meet criteria.)
  - o 1 apartment is vacant due to an eviction, but needs cleaned and renovated until it can be advertised.
- A common occurrence, at the shelter, is individuals just walking out and not returning.
- Family Services has the capability to text individuals now.

#### Hope for the Homeless (Lisa)

• The next Hope for the Homeless meeting is Friday, May 10, 2024 at 9:00 a.m.

#### **Other Programs:**

Lead Abatement Program (Trina Illig)

• Trina stated that there are 14 active units, 9 of which came from the Whole Home program.

#### Owner Occupied Rehab - Trina Illig

- Project 1: sewer lateral
- Project 2: code violation

\$29,000 out of \$50,000 in funds remain.

#### TEAMeffort - Scott Durbin

- Scott reported that approximately 760 TEAMeffort campers will be here to do light construction work/repairs during the summer (2<sup>nd</sup> week of June through the end of July). Justin Jones, TEAMeffort leader, will be staying in Blair County during that time.
- In addition to the \$20,000 allocated from the AHTF, Habitat for Humanity is contributing \$30,000 for supplies.

#### Sustainable Housing Program – Missy Gillin

# Greg Werstil Project Update - Greenfield Township, Claysburg

- No further updates from Greg Werstil
- Scott stated that he spoke with Greg and that he still planned to use the \$50,000 to create affordable housing.

# Cornerstone Builers & Supplies (Susan Bonsell) Project Update – 1310 Washington Ave, Tyrone & 612 Park Ave, Tyrone

• No updates on these projects.

The award recipients have until 2025 to finish their projects.

- Scott suggested sending a letter to Greg Werstil and to Susan Bonsell asking for updates on their projects.
- The AHTF members agreed that the remaining \$50,000 of the Sustainable Housing Program should be advertised again to get new applicants.
- Missy to review the application and change the submission date.
- Possibly advertise in the newspaper. Scott and Don talked of letting their associates know about the program.
- Date to submit application would be August 1, 2024.
- No motion is needed by the Board since this program was already approved.
- Commissioners would need to approve the application selected by the AHTF.

# Blair County Code Compliance Repair Assistance Program

- Missy included a draft copy of the guidelines and application for the code compliance program.
- Missy stated that the county solicitor did review them and stated that when the new income guidelines are released that that information would need to be updated in the application.
- Packets will be available at the Township/Municipalities buildings and City of Altoona Codes office.
- It will be the responsibility of the homeowner to fill out the application and to get the bids for the repairs.

Scott Durbin made a motion to approve the new Blair County Code Compliance Repair Assistance Program, with an allocation of \$50,000 from the AHTF and a \$5,000 cap per project. Don Delozier seconded the motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

#### The Commissioners will also need to approve this program.

#### Open Discussion

- Scott met with some staff at the City of Altoona to discuss the County's Demolition Fund since it is not being utilized.
- Scott stated that there is some confusion as to what the official guidelines are of the demo program. It is not clear if the guidelines are defined in Act 137/Act 152 or if the AHTF created the current guidelines. Also, the cap of \$10,000 and up to 50% match per unit does not really add up when looking at past projects.

# **Questions that came up:**

- ➤ If the cap and match could be changed?
- ➤ What is the exact definition of site control?
- Trina stated that the problem lies with privately owned property. You have to go through a codes process showing that the homeowner is non-compliant.
- Trish to look through Jim's files to see if she can locate any further details on the demo program.
- Scott would like to see if the cap and match can be changed since the cost to demolish properties have increased over the past few years.
- Commissioner Webster added that the county would be willing to work with the City of Altoona regarding properties that are on the repository.
- Trina explained how municipal liens work on properties that are privately owned.
- A suggestion was made to have the new solicitors for the county look over the demo guidelines.
- Trina stated that the definitions of blight cannot be changed.
- Prior to the next meeting, Tricia will communicate, via email, with the group about any communications regarding the demo fund.
- No motions were made regarding changes to the demolition fund. This topic will be revisited at the next meeting in August.
