CALL TO ORDER:

Commissioner Erb called the meeting to order.

MOMENT OF SILENT REFLECTION:

Commissioner Erb called for a moment of silent reflection.

Commissioner Erb requested that those present stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Commissioner Erb called for public comment. There were no comments noted.

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COMMISSIONERS COMMENTS:

Commissioner Erb called for commissioners comments.

Commissioner Beam expressed well wishes to the Bishop Guilfoyle boys' basketball team, the Altoona girls' basketball team, and the Bellwood Antis girls' basketball team as they compete in round two of the state basketball playoff games. He also expressed congratulations to the St. Francis University Red Flash Women's team who made the NCAA Women's Tournament by winning the Northeast Conference.

Commissioner Tomassetti acknowledged and thanked the Blair County Genealogy Society, especially Elaine Conrad and Jim Snyder for their efforts to unveil the identity and representation of the sculpted heads on the exterior of the 1876 portion of the Courthouse. Commissioner stated that several of the heads have been identified in terms of likeness, etc. He also stated that he would be inviting members of the society to an upcoming commissioner meeting to show where they are at in their efforts and to reveal the matches they have identified.

Commissioner Tomassetti noted his abstention on consent agenda item f, due to a conflict of interest for the payment of Invoice #2, received from Keller Engineers, Inc., in the amount of \$13,765.01, for Preliminary Design Services.

Motion by Commissioner Beam, seconded by Commissioner Erb and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 87-2018.

Commissioner Tomassetti noted his abstention on voting on the adoption of Resolution 88-2018 due to a conflict of interest.

Resolution 89-2018: A resolution approving the County of Blair Affordable Housing Trust Fund Program Disbursement in the amount of \$14,300.00, for the renovation of a 2-bedroom apartment next to the Teen Shelter to create an affordable housing opportunity. Total cost of renovation project is \$28,600.00 with the remaining amount being matched through HealthChoices Reinvestment.

Motion by Commissioner Beam, seconded by Commissioner Erb and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 89-2018.

OLD BUSINESS:

Lawyers Lobby:

Dave Albright presented a proposal received from Contract Hardware, in the amount of \$9,006.00, for the replacement of one door in the Lawyer's Lobby.

Mr. Albright stated that a single quote for a fire-rated, wooden replica door was solicited for the replacement of the current steel fire door in the Lawyers Lobby. The proposal is compete with hardware, jambs and a factory finish.

Commissioner Erb asked Mr. Albright if he obtained multiple quotes. Mr. Albright replied no and explained why only one quote was obtained.

Commissioner Beam expressed his concern with having received only one quote for such a high priced door.

Mr. Albright stated that it would take approximately six to eight weeks from acceptance of the proposal for delivery of the door and that obtaining multiple quotes could be accomplished without impacting the overall timeline of the project.

Discussion followed.

Mr. Albright was asked to obtain additional quotes.

NEW BUSINESS:

Pennsylvania 529 College Savings Program (PA 529):

Presentation by Kelly Davis, Field Representative PA Bureau of Savings Program.

Ms. Davis stated that the biggest advantage for participants in a PA 529 savings plan is the tax advantages. She stated that 529 contributions can be deducted on state tax returns in an amount up to \$15,000.00 per year, per beneficiary, or up to \$30,000.00 per year, per beneficiary, for married couples, provided each spouse has an income of at least \$15,000.00. Earnings are not subject to annual taxation for either Federal or PA Income Taxes when funds are used for qualified expenses.

Ms. Davis stated that there are two plans to choose from, the PA 529 Guaranteed Savings Plan (GSP) and the PA 529 Investment Plan (IP). She stated that the GSP is growth based on tuition inflation and the IP is managed by the VanGuard Group in which growth returns are based on investment options that are selected by the participant. She stated that account funds from either plan can be used for K-12 tuition expenses up to \$10,000.00 per year, per beneficiary as well as for qualifying higher education expenses at most colleges, universities and career schools nationwide and abroad including: tuition, fees, books, certain room and board expenses and equipment, and computers.

Ms. Davis stated that contributions can be made in any amount, minimum of \$15.00 for the GSP and \$25.00 for the IP, and contributions can be made in a lump sum, periodically or automatically by payroll deduction or bank transfer. She stated that there is no cost to the county, as the PA 529 College Savings Program would be offered as a voluntary employee benefit. There is a \$50.00 enrollment fee for participation in the PA 529 GSP, however, that fee would be waived for all employees opening new accounts. Enrollment in the PA 529 IP is free.

Discussion followed.

2018 Blair County Transportation Infrastructure/Roadmap Funding Program:

Brian Wiser presented discussion concerning a proposal received from Keller Engineers, Inc., for County Road 101, Corridor Phase 2, Transportation Infrastructure/Roadmap Program, in the total estimated cost of \$4,870,000.00.

Mr. Wiser stated that in 2017 Governor Wolfe introduced the Transportation Infrastructure/Roadmap Program. He stated that this program provides the opportunity for counties that have adopted the \$5.00 registration for local use fee to match up to a \$2,000,000.00 with Roadmap Program funds.

Mr. Wiser stated that the county's vision is to improve the County Road 101 Corridor, which spans approximately seven (7) miles from East Freedom to Sproul. This funding would allow for eight (8) structurally deficient bridges to be replaced or rehabilitated to allow for future improvements, including improvements to the drainage and eventual paving.

Discussion followed.

Resolution 90-2018: A resolution approving Blair County's Transportation Infrastructure/Roadmap Program, in the total estimated cost of \$4,870,000.00, for submission to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for further discussion.

County Administrator Schmitt stated that Solicitor Karn has reviewed the agreement and did request changes to the agreement. She stated that the requested changes have been forwarded to the HR Office, as of this time she has not received confirmation that they have accepted those changes, however, given the urgency in filling these positions, she asked that the board consider taking action pending acceptance of the requested changes.

Discussion followed.

Mr. Weakland explained the need for the amendment to the agreement. County Administrator Schmitt stated that the amendment is pending Solicitor Karn's review; however due to the urgency in this matter she requested that the board considering taking action pending approval of solicitor review.
