Commissioner Kessling called for Commissioners Comment.

Commissioner Burke stated that she is grateful for our county employees that helped with the ballots. There were employees from 10 different departments that helped process mail-in ballots and several other groups that offered to help. There was so much work done that the other groups did not need to come in, but she is very appreciative of their offer. For taking people out of their normal roles and expecting so much from them in such a high-pressured situation, everyone important in order to get the counting done in a timely manner and to report the results as expected. Everyone worked as worked hard and got done quicker than expected. She is grateful for everyone that was willing to take time out of their normal schedule, changing their schedules in some cases, and some working overnight in order to get this done. This was team, and she appreciates every single person who took time away from their duties to help

Commissioner Kessling added that the county faced challenges this election. This was the first presidential election that he participated in. The fact that we received a bomb threat and everyone had to stop everything they were doing, evacuate from the building, and were not allowed back in the building until the building was cleared; everyone probably doesn't understand the monumental tasks that occurred flawlessly. They were able to move everything to a Allegheny Police Departments that responded immediately, along with Pennsylvania State Police and the Blair County Sheriff's Department. The sheriff's officer, "Canine Rick," who is a bomb dog, cleared staff vehicles so the staff could entire operation back to the Elections Office, where they then picked up where they left off. to the convention center and then cleared the entire building. Once the building was cleared, staff was able to move the secondary site and execute that move flawlessly. The Board of Commissioners wishes to thank the Hollidaysburg and our people. It is amazing. He said he has been involved with planning and exercises, and he was pleased with how moothly this went for never having done this before. It was Teamwork. Everyone did what they needed to do without complaint. To all the staff members out there who switched their shifts to accommodate the elections office and all the people that stayed late to continue to ensure the count was done in a timely manner..."My hat is off to them!" The Board is extremely appreciative for everything that everyone did. "Thank You So Much For Everything!" entire operation back to the Elections Office, where they then picked up where they left off.
